Senate to Hold Hearing on Cyber Attacks During Pandemic

The Senate Judiciary Committee's intellectual property subcommittee plans to hold a Sept. 23 hearing titled, "Examining Threats to American Intellectual Property: Cyber-attacks and Counterfeits During the COVID-19 Pandemic." The hearing is scheduled to start at 2:30 p.m. in Room 226 of the Dirksen Senate Office Building. The scheduled witnesses are Adam Hickey, deputy assistant attorney general in the Department of Justice's National Security Division; Clyde Wallace, deputy assistant director-Cyber Operation Branch at the Federal Bureau of Investigation; Steve Francis, assistant director-HSI Global Trade Investigations Division and director of the National Intellectual Property Rights Center at U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement; and Bryan Ware, assistant director-cybersecurity at the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency.
