paragraph (a) by the date specified above,
(i) the Commission will have established a prima facie case of civil
contempt against Respondent Covington for its failure to comply with the
Order directing it to produce documents; and
(ii) Respondent will be in civil contempt for failure to comply with that
Order without further notice or hearing.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a copy of this Order and the papers supporting the
Commission's application be served upon Respondent on or before, 202_ by personal
delivery, facsimile, overnight courier, email, or first-class mail.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Respondent shall deliver any opposing papers in
response to the application no later than, 202_ at 5:00 p.m. Service shall be made by
